I am writing in regards to certain ads that I have seen of late regarding the Remington Arms line of rifles and certain points that I feel are misleading regarding those same ads. First off let me say that I am and have long been a Remington Arms fan. At the present time I own four of your fine rifles and with the exception of one of those rifles have nothing but good things to say about them.
