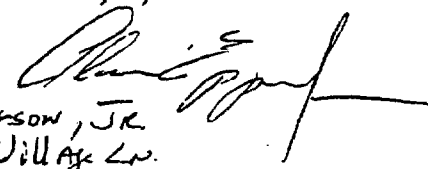

I take care of my hunting and fishing equipment like a woman does her silverware.

I personally think that Remington-Union Arms Co. should pay for the incurred repairs to this rifle and thank God, like I do, that no one was injured or killed.
