Dear Mr. Ruch:

Discharge has been completed on your Model 700 AML 270 caliber rifle, Serial No. 610580, which you returned to us because it allegedly fired when the safety was pushed to the off position. We sincerely regret the unfortunate incident as it is not representative of Remington-Union.

An expert thorough examination of the rifle and trigger assembly has not duplicated the incident you have described. All parts, tolerances, and dimensions were found to be normal including wear component adjustment. Also, factory seals were intact on the trigger adjustment screws, indicating no alterations were made to the trigger outside of our Company.

We also advised that the rifle was assembled in February, 1971, and that it continued to pass pressure proof test, stillery test, and final inspection, indicating that it had successfully passed all necessary tests prior to shipment.

Based on our findings, Remington-Union Company, Inc., cannot accept any liability or responsibility for the accident. It is possible that while the rifle was in the safety lever from the "safe" position to the "fire" position, the trigger was inadvertently pulled or the safety was not fully engaged. The rifle was discharged as it was pushed to the "fire" position. The safety lever was pulled with the trigger and the rifle was discharged.

We regret that we cannot provide the circumstances that could have caused the incident. The rifle was fired and is a product of Remington-Union.
