I have owned a host of Remingtons through the years and still have several. This gun was the purchase of a lifetime for me. My first impulse was to get rid of this gun and every other Remington that I own. To say that my confidence has been shaken would be an understatement. Whatever happens I doubt that I will ever feel comfortable hunting with this gun again.

After giving this some thought I didn't want to inflict this upon someone else and felt you should know about the problem I am doing this for your benefit as well as the safety of others.

Here is what has happened in the deer stand:

Game appears, I push off the safety and squeeze the trigger but it won't pull. I check the safety and squeeze the trigger again and it still won't pull.

I eject the shell, upon injecting the next shell the gun goes off as the bolt is closed.
