to take the shell out of the chamber before bringing the gun up into the stand. I raised up on the bolt in order to eject the shell. Because I had the safety on, the bolt would obviously not raise. Upon pushing the safety forward to allow me to raise the bolt, the rifle suddenly fired! This time I was being extremely careful and I was very aware of where my hands and fingers were at all times. Fortuneately the bullet went harmlessly into the ground 5 feet in front of me. However, I am now 100% completely positive that the rifle malfunctioned and it was not my error. The other two previous occasions now became understandable.

This malfunction is obviously a defect in workmanship or material. This malfunction is extremely dangerous and could be lethal. I expect Remington to rectify the situation before someone is injured! I feel that you should take the gun back and refund me my money, replace the defective rifle with a new model, or repair the gun satisfactorily and certify its safety at no cost to me.
