Per our conversation approximately one week ago enclosed you will find my Remington 30-06 rifle.


As we discussed I placed some equipment that I was carrying into my vehicle and also my rifle. I don't ordinarily place a loaded weapon in my car but as my arms were full of gear I did on this occasion. I removed the shells from the magazine and proceeded to remove the safety to unload the remaining shell from the chamber when the weapon discharged and the slug went through my seat and door of the vehicle.

I feel very fortunate that I was hunting alone and no one was injured. Ordinarily I would have unloaded the weapon before leaving the woods. I can't begin to tell you how upset I was because this happened and would find it impossible to feel any trust in this weapon until such time as it is looked over and repaired. I feel confident however that you will once again put the weapon in safe working order.

Fortunately I viewed the news program which showed another hunter having had the same unfortunate discharge of his weapon (Remington 30-06 Mod 700) which resulted in the loss of his foot or I may have not realized the problem.

I appreciate your concern and the concern of Remington Arms in correcting this problem and for the safety of other hunters. I am looking forward to many happy hunting hours with this rifle and my other Remington rifles.
