SUBJECT: DEVELOPMENT NOTES, 929-VZB RIFLE

The understanding of the basis for developing the new arms is that responsibility for design, development and establishment of the initial process of all new weapons rests in the Technical Department until the new processes have been tried out in pilot production upon which the responsibility will shift to the plant.
