it your request I thoroughly examined the rifle but was unsuccessful in obtaining any evidence indicating a displacement of metal. Twenty-five rounds of stendard Benington amountaion were fired thru the subject gun while the action and stock were completely surrounded with white blotter paper. There was no evidence on the paper of powder on the gunduring firing.

\*White blotter paper is used in the defective ammittion testing to pick up evidence of escaping breech gas. The paper surrounds the action at a distance of 3. Another piece of blotter paper is placed in a vertical position at the comb section of the stock, comparable to the shooter's eye position. White blotter paper will absorb powder particles comparably with human flesh and is acceptable in U. S. Courts as a practical laboratory material substituting for human flesh.
