EXPORT LICENSE AND GOVERNMENT APPROVAL

All deliveries are contingent upon the issuance of a covering Export License from the United States Department of State, and should it be necessary, an allotment of "controlled materials" and a related Priority Rating for other materials essential in the manufacture and packing of these rifles.

FORCE MAJEURE

In the event that we are delayed in delivering any or all of the rifles mentioned above by reason of fire, flood, explosion, accident, sabotage, riot, acts of God, war, labor troubles, labor shortage, inability to obtain essential materials or equipment, actions by the United States Government, or for any cause whatsoever beyond the control and without the fault of the seller, whether or not of the kinds hereinbefore enumerated, this agreement shall, as to the rifles so affected, but not otherwise, be suspended during the time any such cause for delay is present, and all such rifles shall be delivered as soon as practicable after such disability is removed.

TERMS OF PAYMENT

Payment of \$3,000,000 shall be made at the time of placing the order. The balance of the payment is to be covered by a Letter of Credit stating that payment shall be made against delivery of the rifles.

GENERAL

**Safety:** Thumb operated lever located at right side of receiver, near grip.

**Stock:** Springfield 1903A3 design  
Description - American Walnut with oil finish, half pistol grip. 3 take-down screws, 2 sling swivels.

**Hand Guard:** American Walnut

**Triggers:** 4 - 6 lbs. pull, no drag, no backlash  
Material - Steel with black oxide finish. Pan corrugated.

**Trigger Guard:** Steel with black oxide finish. Attached to receiver with take-down screws.

**Packings:** Material - Single gun and multiple unit cartons to be 200# Mullen Test (100% Kraft single corrugated board)  
Exterior carton to be 350# Mullen Test (100% Kraft double wall corrugated board)  
Type - Each gun packed individually in a telescope carton, five units to a multiple carton, then over-packed in an exterior carton wirestrapped with 3/8" wide strapping bands.
