INSTRUCTIONS

All computations, of whatever kind, are to be made in these books except in cases where special blank's may be provided for specific kinds of computation. Computations may be made in ink or pencil, whichever may be the more convenient. Pencil figuring should be done with a soft pencil. All the work of computation should be done in these books, including all detail figures.

As a rule each subject should begin on a new page, but if only a few lines are required for a calculation, two or more subjects may be treated on the same page. A line should be drawn across the page to separate the different subjects. The subject, with the date of beginning it, should be plainly written at the top of the specimen.

Work should be done systematically and as neatly as consistent with rapidity. The books are, however, intended for convenience, and no unnecessary work should be done for sake of appearance only. Erases should be erased off instead of erased, except where the latter will facilitate the work. Work should not be crowded. Paper costs less than the time which would be expended in attempting to economize space or in making erasures.

Where curves drawn on section paper are necessary parts of a computation, they should be pasted in the book, except where specifically otherwise provided for.

Computations should be indexed, in the back of the book, by the person using the book.

Upon completion of a book it must be turned over to the Head of the division, who will "Q. K." it if satisfactory, and who will have the subject matter card-indexed after which the book will be placed on file for future reference within his department.

A record will be kept of all books issued, and the practice to whom they are issued will be held responsible for them until turned in as above directed.

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On 6 Sept 1962 at 2222 hours at Chamberlain Field in Champaign, Illinois, 1 Power Tanker, 1000 gal. tank, 2000 ft. long & 30 in. dia. was filled with water. 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On Sept 8 1961 it was found that the group of 2000 grays at the mouth of the river were all dead. The cause of death was unknown. It was only after further investigation that it was determined to be "disease" which had spread over the hands as well as the feet. The disease was later found to have been caused by a bacterium *Staphylococcus aureus* attached to the skin of the fish. This disease probably originated from the water in which the fish had been kept in tanks and is a result of poor husbandry / clinical condition of the salmon previously held at the hatchery. The disease was first noticed at the hatchery on Sept 1st.
