I have one of your new Remington .221 Fireball Pistols and I will appreciate any information that you have available as to the change of the point of impact as the barrel warms. The groups with hand loads at 130 yards are excellent but there seems to be no consistency about the first two or three shots fired from a cold, clean barrel.

Also I should like to know if it is possible to purchase the weaker extractor spring, as the one that has been used in my pistol, will throw the fired case ten to twelve feet.
