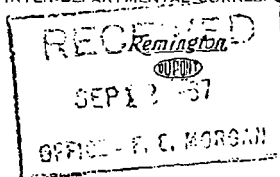

Dear Pete:

Accuracy - Is much better than our present 660 due to the heavier barrel. This will also be true in all calibers that are chambered in this new model.

Appearance - Vastly improved and has fine "NEW EXTRAS" that will help sell this new model.

Most important are:

WITHOUT THE RIB

Heavier barrel - better accuracy

HOODED BOLT - safety and appearance

RW Finish - forend cap and spacers.

Comments- I would suggest that the Sports Writers, if at all possible, be sent the 6mm as this caliber is pleasant to shoot. The 308 has some recoil and also accuracy will also be better in reports by these writers. It will also give the 6mm an additional needed boost in popularity.

An exception might be made to - Elmer Keith - he would praise the 350 REMINGTON Magnum only.

This new change will result in a great sales year for this model and give this carbine type of rifle a shot in the arm.

The gun is being returned to Elton to V. G. De Reus.
