March 18, 1959

Safety

- Last week Ilion exceeded old record by 100 days. A continuous safety job to instill proper attitudes for new employees to be maintained with alertness on part of older employees.
- Green Card system still a good barometer, and when did you last make a safety check observation?
- Off-the-Job Injuries How many contacts have you made with your people? Research traffic casualty this month --- almost a fatality for the driver, and others of family seriously injured.
- Associated Industries of New York Safety Campaign continues through March.
- Need for record of inspection cards for dust collectors. Responsibility of supervision to initiate.
- Question of wearing neckties around machinery.
- Proposed new safety meeting idea for month of April.
- Chemical Hazards New "Videx" lube requires need to wash hands after exposure.
- Housekeeping Inspections One Research section with no report record for February.
- The pattern of injuries both on and off the job appears to point towards need for more attention to the younger employees. Follow-up should be made to complete employee contacts regarding reduction of Off-the-Job injuries, and turn in report through line organization as to status of this program, giving priority to first line supervision.
