In your letter dated March 13, 1970 you comment that sholesale C 11 Amorts have included 10-15 cases of extraction difficulties with the Model 700, particularly the 7mm magnum.

Your commants match our experience at Ilian on customer returned rishes during the past several conths. We first became sware of this problem in October 1969 when Ruch dilson and Lie Braun reported difficulties on the West Coast.

Since then we have had numerous reports from around the country and have also examined many customer returned Fodel 700, 7mm magnum rifler. Breed on three reports and returned rifles, we have corrected oursent production and are experiencing were low collery rejects. Our corrective action at Ilion was in these thr e different areas:

- . Bland holt head and extractor we have cooled the Model 742 Trocess which is more extensive than the Model 700 and are polishing the critical cartridge entrance surface at the bolt head.
- Extractor adjustment Dach bolt head is reinspected to assure that the unrestrained end of the extractor does not "rotrude into the holt head.
- Emtractor rivet The rivet hole has been repositioned to simulify the above two prorations.

For field repairs we have recommended that gunsmiths replace the extractor and blend the holt head and extractor with a dental grinder. It this repair does not improve rifle function then the rifle should be returned to Ilion. In no case do we recommend chamber polishing or head space changes since we have no assurance that gunsmiths have gages to Remington - SAAMI specifications.
