SUBJECT: RECEIVER-BARREL MARKING: MOHANK 600

Reference is made to your letter of June 29, 1970, and to Print No. C-90382 of 6-26-70 forwarded therewith, which shows "Mohawk" separated by a target symbol from "M-600".

This is probably the best trademark practice but it is my understanding from Herb Albaugh's letter of June 2, 1970, that Marketing prefers to couple the "600" directly with the "Mohawk" trademark.

As pointed out in my letter of June 24, 1970, we can probably support a registration of "Mohawk" by itself on the basis of the use on the cartons and, as I indicated in that letter, I believe that I can now approve a marking of "Mohawk-600" as shown on Print C-90382 of 5-13-70, submitted with your letter of May 15, 1970.

I have just talked to Pete Morgan and told him that this is a Marketing decision and that we will go along with whichever marking they prefer. He confirms their preference for "Mohawk-600".
