M/700 BDL SKIPLINE CHECKERING
(Item 3 - Dev. Sched.)3. M/700 BDL Skipline Checkering

R & D reported that the M/700 BDL with skipline checkering dresses up the model while at the same time gives a definite model distinction between the classic and BDL checkering patterns. This change will also give Production approximately 10% more machine capacity on the checkering machines as the skipline pattern has a shorter machine cycle.

A prototype rifle was shown.

Production reported that during the changeover to the new checkering, there would be a mix of checkering. This will continue into 1978 because of the large number of specifications in this rifle.
