the M788 but that doesn't mean it couldn't be accomplished. I do not recall whether a model was made but I remember that strength testing of the competitive bolt action shotguns revealed weaknesses in their bolt handle lock up which would not be acceptable. Therefore our rear multiple lock method was superior. The trigger mechanism of the M788 was a natural for the shotgun and provided a clean crisp let off with very fast lock time of around 2.7 ms.

The reason we did not pursue the program further was because of Mr. Coleman's reluctance in lieu of a bad image for Remington which he thought would lower the status of the M1100.

At that time marketing speculated we would sell 50,000 units a year.
