M700 DETACHABLE MAGAZINE BOX

The sample having a roller latch has been assembled and the inital test was acceptable. More testing is planned. EMT has been shown the system and had favorable comments regarding manufacturing and assembly. More input from management will be sought as parts are finalized.

A visit to IOSSO to discuss plating of this item was made Monday 23 Sept. 1991. Five samples were carried to their facility and it is planned to plate them in two different thickness dims., two at .0002/.0003 and two at .0003/.0004. The fifth sample will be used as a set up sample. Parts will be in house the middle of October.

.35 WHELEN M7400

Request from production to assist in the developement of this item has been received. Based on work done it is felt that this can be done with little difficulty. A sample is being sent to the test lab to verify previous test results on orfice size. Testing will be completed PDQ.

M-24 SNIPER WEAPONS SYSTEM

Two M-24A's have been made and sent to Knight's Armament for fitting of "noise suppresors". This will be completed and the samples evaluated at his facility Sept. 30 thru Oct.2 . It is planned for the writer to do this preliminary evaluation at Knight's factory. Ammunition, stocks and scopes have been sent for this testing. John Rogers will accompany the writer.

XP-100 WOOD STOCK

A program to try to bring this item along faster has been started. A new quote for the stock is being prepared by Bishop. Questions regarding weight will be answered and barrels having the correct contour will be made. Price's for sights and other stocks will also be obtained. Final testing also has to be done including ultimate strength of all calibers.

M700 .223 REM. Barrels are being made for this testing.
