	How can I tell if my gun has been altered - Check cleanliness of gun - Check functioning of gun - Have gunsmith review	It is very difficult to do. The best thing to do is to take it to a qualified gunsmith (or send it to us at Remington) who can look at the various settings of the screws and then identify if it in fact has been altered. When we manufacture the firearm we lock tight various screws on the fire control (TPA). It is easy for someone qualified to tell if the gun has been altered by seeing if the seals have been broken..
	Is the Model 700 a safe firearm	Yes it is and for nearly 40 years, the Remington Model 700 bolt-action rifle has been one of America's premier hunting rifles.
