| Bolt Lock safety | Please tell me if my gun has a bolt lock style safety | With a bolt lock safety gun, the safety must be in the "F" or fire position for you to open the bolt on the gun. This contrasts to a non-bolt lock safety firearm where the gun safety can be in either position in order for the bolt to be opened. So in order to test your gun, follow the principles outlined in the 10 commandments of safety, get the firearm out of your gun safe, get the bolt (which should be out of the gun when stored), pick up the gun, make sure that there are no rounds in the gun (chamber and magazine), and that the safety is in the safe "S" position. Install the bolt, close the bolt and then try to open the bolt with the safety still in the safe position. If it will not open, make sure your finger is not on the trigger and that the gun is pointed in a safe direction and install the bolt. Put the safety in the fire "F" position. |

| | Can I get my firearm, which has a bolt lock safety installed updated to a current non-bolt lock safety? How much would it cost? | Yes. We can do it for you in the factory. | | Why would I want a bolt lock safety on my firearm | You may want it for certain hunting applications. For those that do want it, is a matter of personal preference. An example of why someone may want it is that they are traveling, (walking or riding) through heavy brush and wants to have his gun loaded and ready to fire. The individual does not want to take a chance that the bolt handle would be opened up by a foreign substance and then when they get ready to fire the firearm the gun would not work as the bolt handle has been lifted. Note: We do not recommend having your gun loaded as you travel through the woods. |
