Dear Mr. Evans,  
Thank you for your inquiry. We have a Safety Modification Program on certain model bolt action rifles. This is a voluntary program, it is not a recall. This is designed to remind people of the existence of the bolt-lock feature and to offer customers the opportunity to modernize their products.

The Sportsman 78 is not included in this program. These rifles have been manufactured since 1982 and do not have a bolt lock mechanism. As a result these rifles may be loaded or unloaded with the safety in the "S" or "On safe" position.

Nevertheless, as with any firearm, special care must be taken during the loading and unloading process. Always keep the muzzle pointed in a safe direction. Always unload your rifle when not actually in use. Keep the safety in the "S" or "On safe" position at all times until you are ready to shoot. Every firearm should be unloaded as soon as you are finished shooting - before taking it into your car, camp or house. Remington wants you to enjoy the shooting sports - safely!
