help, my gramps bought a model 600 6mm for my gramma in 1965 ish. it was given to me to use in 1978. i love this gun- period- end of story. i shoot it for mule deer, elk, and javelina's. i use the 100 grain pointed soft for all. and they work well. my son turns 10 this september. he will be able to go on his 1st hunt in february. for javelina's. i do not want to part with my 6mm, but because it's a short barrel- and real light- it fits him weel, except he's lefthanded. and it's righthanded. i cannot find a 6mm anything- anywhere. i saw a model 788 in 6mm at a used gun store, it was in bad shape- and the action was stoppy. i went to a new gun store (jensens arizona sportsman) here in tucson and they told me a bunch of bad news. you don't make 6mm's anymore, much less a lefthanded one- in any model. there is one that you call a varmint something, with a "heavy barrel" i do not know what that is, and it's very expensive to say the least. you don't make a compact model anymore, and nothing in 6mm. i also have my dad's model 760 gamemaster pump .308, plus a 30-06 closely related the the gamemaster. we only have remington firearms, and they last so long we never have to buy new ones unless a new hunter comes along. but if you guys do not make the gun i want to buy for my son- one that will most surely last his lifetime, then i may have to consider another gun manufacturer, against my choice. please reply to me soon, as i'm in need of your help. thank you. michael waite c/o waite ranch tucson/marana, AZ
