Thank you for contacting Remington Country. We have not made any changes in the triggers offered in the early 90's to now except for the trigger pull. They average around 4 1/2 lbs on current production triggers.

We will need the serial numbers of the rifles in question to check for any previous recalls.

Good afternoon,

I am trying to answer some questions raised by members of our Tactical Team. They have heard "rumors" that there are documented accidental discharges associated with the 700 PSS. These "rumors" have caused them to lose faith in their issued 700 PSS, even if they haven't experienced an accidental discharge. Currently, I have four of the weapons in inventory purchased from 1991 to 1997. My administration is concerned about liability if these "rumors" are true and considering replacing the weapons.

The only evidence I could locate on a/d's is related to civilian models of the 700 and the trigger housing. Is there a difference between the trigger housing on the civilian models and the PSS? Has Remington made any changes in the trigger housing since I purchased my weapons?

I am a former Team member and carried a 700 PSS for several years. I was very happy with the weapon and never experienced an a/d during the time I was assigned as a Counter-Sniper. I would like to put this to rest if at all possible and would appreciate any information or assistance you could provide.
