The Model 722 was virtually an identical gun except it was chambered for short action calibers only and was in production at the same time. Both of these guns were replaced by the Remington Model 700 in 1963. According to the information that you provided, your Remington Model 721 was produced in or around 1950. These guns originally sold for around \$79.95 and did not come with any sling swivels installed from the factory.

As with any used firearm, we would strongly recommend you have the firearm serviced and evaluated by a competent gunsmith for function and safety.
