By answering it legitimately, what are the safety issues with adjusting the three screws? People are adjusting their triggers and they need to know the issues. Currently, I am of the impression that the sear engagement and pull weight are not independent of each other and that an adjustment to one could alter an otherwise perceived safe setting on the other. I test my adjustments with vigorous bolt closures and opening, and by bumping the butt on the floor with the safety both off and on.
