



To Adjust the Sights



*Adjustable with sights are
adjusted at the factory to hit
a target at 100 yards.*


TO ADJUST THE REAR SIGHT:

For elevation (up and down adjustments) and windage (left and right adjustments), move the rear sight in the same direction as you need to move the bullet on the target. See Picture 12.

NOTE: For more information on ballistics and trajectory, see the REMINGTON catalog.

TELESCOPIC SIGHTS:

The top of the receiver has holes for the installation of telescopic sights.



POSITION ON TARGET	ADJUSTMENTS
Bullet hits above the center.	a. Loosen the elevation screw on the rear sight. b. Turn the elevation screw clockwise on the rear sight. c. Tighten the elevation screw.
Bullet hits below the center.	a. Loosen the elevation screw on the rear sight. b. Turn the rear sight up (clockwise) on the slide. c. Tighten the elevation screw.
Bullet hits to the left.	a. Loosen the windage screw clockwise on the rear sight. b. Turn the rear sight up (clockwise) on the slide. c. Tighten the windage screw.
Bullet hits to the right.	a. Loosen the windage screw on the rear sight. b. Turn the rear sight up (clockwise) on the slide. c. Tighten the windage screw.

Lubrication and Maintenance

NOTE: The chamber should be cleaned before loading and firing the gun for the first time. Follow cleaning instructions shown in page 14.

Over lubrications should be avoided at all times. A thin coat of Remington Oil is needed to prevent the possibility of rusting. See notes below.

When the barrel is to be cleaned, it should be carefully cleaned and thoroughly dried. Outside surfaces should be wiped with a soft cloth to keep off dust accumulation.

When the chamber is to be cleaned, all excess lubricant must be removed. If it does not and note must be thoroughly wiped away.

NOTE: Remington Rem™ Oil is available in many local dealers or distributor offices or by mail order from Remington Arms Company.

TO CLEAN THE BARREL:

WARNING: Check the chamber and magazine areas periodically for debris or foreign material.

1. Use the instructions and the equipment provided for good cleaning. For recommendations, see your Remington Authorized Gunsmith.
2. Select the correct caliber cleaning brush and attach the brush to the cleaning rod.
3. Put the cleaning brush into the gun cleaning solvent.
4. Push the cleaning brush through the barrel several times.

NOTE: Always clean the barrel from the front end. See number 5.

5. Remove the brush from the rod. Attach the well-combusted cleaning patch and push through the bore.
6. Repeat several times using a new cleaning patch each time until the patch is not dirty.
7. Push a clean patch saturated with solvent through the barrel.
8. Push a clean, dry patch through the barrel to remove excess lubricant.
9. Apply a thin coat of Rem™ Oil to the outside of the barrel with a soft, clean cloth.

WARNING: After cleaning, always leave the barrel to five degrees centigrade.
