TELESCOPIC SIGHTS:

The top of the receiver has tabs for the installation of telescopic sights.

Lubrication and Maintenance



Always keep your rifle stored in a safe. To carefully clean and thoroughly oil. Clean surfaces should be wiped with a light coat of Rem™ Oil occasionally. Once a year it is recommended all excess lubrication is removed. The rifle star and bolt must be thoroughly worked.

NOTE: Remington® Bar™ Oil is available from your local dealer. If your dealer is not a stock, ask your local Remington® dealer for the Remington® Bar™ Oil.

To Clean the Barrel

WARNING! Check the chamber and magazine to make sure there are no cartridges in the system.

1. Use the equipment provided in a good cleaning kit. For recommendations, see your REMINGTON AUTHORIZED GUNSMITH.
2. Remove the bolt assembly. See the instructions on page 9.
3. Select the correct caliber cleaning brush and attach the brush to the cleaning rod.
4. Put the cleaning brush into the gun cleaning solvent.

NOTE: Barrel should lay horizontally with the ejection port facing down during cleaning. Always clean the barrel from the chamber end to the muzzle.

5. Push the cleaning brush through the barrel several times.
6. Remove brush from rod, a fast tap with pencil, and push the rod through.
7. Repeat several times, using a new cleaning patch each time, until the patch is completely dry.
8. Push a clean patch saturated with Rem™ Oil through the barrel.
9. Push a clean dry patch through the barrel to remove excess lubricant.
10. Apply a thin coat of Rem™ Oil to the outside of the barrel with a soft clean cloth.
11. After cleaning the barrel, clean the receiver and the trigger assembly.

WARNING! This firearm should be cleaned and stored in a secure container. Company, Inc. or a REMINGTON NECO COMPANY AUTHORIZED DEALER. This will ensure that the rifle is stored in a safe and secure location. Do not store in a gun rack.

To Clean the Receiver and Trigger Assembly

1. Put the safety mechanism in the "S" position.
2. Remove the bolt assembly. See instructions on page 9.
3. Turn the rifle upside down.
4. Remove the stock screws. See Picture 16.
5. Lift the stock away from the receiver and trigger assembly.

MODELS WITHOUT A FLOOR PLATE ONLY:

Remove the magazine spring and follower from the receiver.

NOTE: Clean and lubricate the receiver and trigger assembly first until. Do not remove the trigger assembly from the receiver.

6. Thoroughly spray the receiver inside and out with Rem™ Action Cleaner and allow to dry.
7. Thoroughly spray inside the trigger assembly at the bore ports as specified in Picture 17 with Rem Action Cleaner.
8. Place the safety in the fire "F" position. Pull the trigger rearward and release multiple times.
9. Pull and hold the trigger rearward with an appropriate punch or screwdriver depress the sear (Lubrication Point) in Picture 17 or page 13) and release multiple times.
10. Release the trigger and operate the safety from the fire "F" to the safe "S" position multiple times.

 Bullet hits above the center.	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Loosen the elevation screw on the rear sight. 2. Slide the rear sight down (downward or clockwise) to raise the elevation screw. 3. Tighten the elevation screw.
 Bullet hits below the center.	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Loosen the elevation screw on the rear sight. 2. Slide the rear sight up (upward or counter-clockwise) to raise the elevation screw. 3. Tighten the elevation screw.
 Bullet hits to the left.	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Loosen the windage screw on the rear sight. 2. Slide the rear sight to the right. 3. Tighten the windage screw.
 Bullet hits to the right.	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Loosen the windage screw on the rear sight. 2. Slide the rear sight to the left. 3. Tighten the windage screw.
