

REMINGTON INTRODUCES NEW AUTOLOADING CENTERFIRE RIFLE THE MODEL 750" WOODSMASTER"

Madison, NC -- Remington has a long history of designing and building reliable and fast-handling autoloading centerfire rifles and the newest member of this clite family is the Model 750 Woodsmaster. For 2006, this redesigned, gas-operating autoloader will be chambered in five popular calibers - .243 Win, .308 Win, .370 Win, .30-06 and .35 Whelen with carbine versions of .308 Win, .30-06 and .35 Whelen available.

Remington introduced the first autoloading centerfire rifle to the U.S. marketplace in 1906 but with manufacturing and design advancements, the Model 8 was spon replaced with a succession of popular Remington® autoloading rifles from the Model 740, Model 742 and Model Four to the venerable Model 7400TM which is still available today in a durable synthetic offering.

The Model 750 Woodsmaster combines cosmetic and performance enhancements with the time-proven design features of its predecessor, the Model 7400. To improve the reliability and smooth operation of this autoloading rifle, the gas system has been modified to provide more consistent bolt velocities, less fouling and greater feeding reliability. To further improve feeding and reduce friction, the breech bolt has an electroless nickel and Teflon® coating. The four-round capacity detachable magazine box is interchangeable with the Model 7400 magazine box and the Woodsmaster is drifted and tapped to accept standard Model 7400 bases.

Not only does the Model 750 sport infernal changes, the exterior has been updated as well for a more modern look. The stock and fore-end have a satisf finish and are constructed from solid American walnut. The fore-end has a semi-beavertail design, features the Rennington "R" logo and handsome cut checkering. The Monte Carlo stock has a lower comb than the Model 7400 and features the recoiling-reducing R3® Pad; black grip cap; and sling swivel study which complete this well-designed centerfire rifle. The solidly-built steel receiver and hammer-forged, carbon steel barrel feature a complimenting high gloss blued finish. The standard 22 and $18^{1/2}$ -inch carbine barrels feature iron sights for added versatility.

Respected for their durability, quick follow-up shots and fast target acquisition, Remington's soft-recoiling autoloading rifles have long been a favorite of deer hunters nationwide. The **Model 750 Woodsmaster** will continue that honored tradition. Available at a suggested retail of \$732.
