Partnered with the Remington Premier® and Express® lines of automaticion, the Model 673 Guide Rifle delivers plenty of punch in an efficient, easy handling rifle.

Complimenting the perfermence of the Model 673 Guide Rifle is its distinguished look, featuring a wide striped, weather resistant, laminated Monte Carlo-style stock of alternating dark and light veneers with deep cut checkering and swivel studs. The 22-inch magnum contour barrel has a distinct, machined steel ventilated rib with iron sights, reminiscent of the Model 600, allowing for quick sight acquisition. The receiver is drilled and tapped for scope mounts. The Mind magazine has a 3 + 1 round capacity with hinged floor plate.
