There is no way to give you my serial number. The only markings on the rifle is the word REMINGTON, and these markings are on the octagonal part of the barrel. The part of the barrel that touches the wood is octagonal and the rest of the barrel is round. The REMINGTON stamp is between the wood and the barrel and there is pin that holds the barrel on to the wood.

There is a hole in the stock covered by a brass plate. There are 2 triggers. The rear trigger is a safety release and the front trigger is the actual trigger.

The barrel comes apart in two pieces. The end with the nipple unscrews from the barrel and allows for cleaning. It is an early model as it was my grandfathers who died in 1949. The barrel is rifled.
