We do not have a record of your previous inquiries. However your firearm was manufactured in or around 1981. We have a Safety Modification Program on certain model bolt action rifles including older model 700 rifles. This is a voluntary program, it is not a recall. This is designed to remind people of the existence of the bolt-lock feature and to offer customers the opportunity to modernize their products. If you have a bolt lock safety, we strongly recommend that you take advantage of this offer.
