when the rifle was first produced, most post WWII rifles were produced with the bolt lock safety, and most shooters were familiar with this feature. Now because firearm training is so different, and consumer demands have changed, we are providing an option for owners of pre '82 rifles to have the change made to their rifle and also to make people aware that the feature exists.

\$20 is a significant discount to the cost of cleaning and inspection particularly if additional repar is required. We feel this is an appropriate charge for guns at least 20 years old.
