Dear Robert:

Thank you for your inquiry. Your Model 700 PSS was manufactured in 1993 at our firearms plant in Iliion New York. Only those Model 700 or 40-X rifles made before March 1982 were manufactured with a bolt-lock mechanism. Model 700 or 40-X rifles made after March 1982 do not have a bolt-lock mechanism and may be loaded and unloaded with the safety in the "S" or "On Safe" position. Consequently, post-1982 Model 700 or 40-X rifles are not subject to this bolt-lock Safety Modification Program. We hope that this information is helpful to you. If you have further questions feel free to contact us.

I have heard reports that some Model 700 centerfire rifles will fire when there is a round in the chamber, the safety is "on", and then when the safety is placed in the "fire" position, the gun can discharge.

I thought I read something about this a year or so ago on your web site.
