Thank you for your patience. The bolt lock would not allow the bolt to be opened until you put it on fire. That ensured that the bolt could not come unlocked as you walked with the firearm and ensured it was still locked in position when you flipped the safety off.

It sounds like your rifle was originally installed with a bolt-lock, which means you have to put the safety switch on fire before you can open the bolt. We are offering a conversion at a special price if you would like your firearm converted, so that you can open the bolt at anytime with the safety on safe.
