We prefer to inspect the rifle with an incident as you described. The trigger may need a good cleaning. We offer a product called RemAction Cleaner that can be sprayed into the trigger assembly to clean out the old lubricants and debris. You would spray it in various areas of the trigger until the liquid runs out clear. It is a self-drying cleaner. You should apply RemOil as described in your owner's manual.
