> > You will see your accuracy drop as the barrel heats up. You should  
> allow  
> the barrel to cool before continuing to shoot. The amount of shots it  
> takes  
> to heat it up depends on the caliber, velocity and the barrel thickness.  
> After about 10 shots you should let it cool before continuing to prevent  
> premature wear.
