Dear Benjamin
These guns were not included in the Safety Modification Program; however, we do suggest that you send your firearm to our flion, NY facility.

For U.S. repairs, please follow these guidelines:

- 1. Record the serial number of your firearm before sending at to us.
- 2. Pack your firearm for safety and to prevent further damage in shipping and handling. Preferably, ship in a firearm box not a hardcase.
- Remove all accessories from your firearm to prevent loss or damage.This would include scope, slings, or extra choke tubes.
- 4. Enclose a letter with the firearm detailing the model name or number of your firearm and serial number along with a full description of the problem. Be sure to include your full name and address (P.O. Box and Street Address), including zip code, daytime telaphone number, and e-mail address.
- 5. Ship your firearm by either United Parcel Service (UPS) or Parcel Post (US Post Office). Remington is not responsible for damage or loss during shipment, so you may elect to purchase insurance from your carrier. Customer is responsible for shipping charges to the factory.
