Thank you for your inquiry. The recoil pads that are used on the custom shop guns are specific to the type of gun and the caliber that you are obtaining. This is an option that can be discussed with your dealer upon ordering. The trigger pull is set to your specification from the custom shop. We do not have a set tolerance with the trigger pull unless you do not specify what pull that you want when you order. We do not put the bolt lock mechanism on any of our custom shop firearms.
